With a team of 9 full time, 2 contract & over 30 causal staff members, the organisation has years of experience in running surfing events and programs throughout the state.

Program Overview

The Surfing Victoria Indigenous Surfing Program utilises the sport of surfing as a vehicle to engage communities across Victoria; and improve health and wellbeing.

Established more than 20 years ago, the programs initial aim was to increase the number of young Indigenous Victorians participating in surfing through lessons including water safety programs. Over time, it evolved into a strong and significant vehicle for social participation of community members as well as increasing employment opportunities for Indigenous Victorians in the surfing industry.

Surfing Victoria has networks across the state that are utilised to provide young Aboriginal men and women with access to education, training and employment opportunities related to the surfing industry. A clear pathway for progression in the sport of surfing has been developed through the establishment of regional surf competitions and programs.

A key success factor to the wide reach of the program and growth in participant numbers is community ownership. Surfing Victoria has a commitment to forming lasting partnerships with their communities. This allows us to conduct programs that are culturally safe and engaging, and create environments that are inclusive, respectful and flexible.

The program sees more than 650 participants annually take part in Surfing and Stand Up Paddleboarding across the state.
